It's up to you!

Courts have the vital responsibility of safeguarding individuals' fundamental rights and liberties through fair, non-partisan, and impartial decisions grounded solely in the Constitution and existing laws. Within our democratic republic, the court system and the voting public serve as the primary checks against abuses of power.

Various entities—including political parties, large corporations, unions, billionaires, and other special interest groups—are attempting to influence and sway courts within your state. It is your duty to protect the integrity of the court system from these external forces that aim to undermine and control the judiciary.

What Actions Can You Take?

- Educate yourself about your local courts and judges.
- Contribute by serving on a jury or grand jury, or by attending court hearings in your community.
- When voting for judges, focus on their character, integrity, competence, and their commitment to deciding cases fairly, rather than just their party affiliation.
- Support the non-partisan selection of judges and encourage candidates who are willing to run as independents.
- Voice your opposition to substantial corporate contributions and dark money in judicial elections.
- Avoid personal attacks on judges who make contentious decisions.
