



Stacey A. Marques was born in Guyana, South America and emigrated in 1980 to join her mother and extended family in Brooklyn, New York. As an ADA in the general crimes division, she prosecuted misdemeanor and felony level crimes committed against the People of the City of New York and took part in the Mock Trial Advocacy Program.

Upon concluding her prosecutorial career, Stacey attended the National Criminal Defense College, in Macon, Georgia. Thereafter, she was both a solo practitioner, providing legal representation in the area of Criminal Defense, Divorce, Family Law, Real Estate and was a member of the New York County and Bronx County Assigned Counsel 18-B Felony Panels. In that capacity, she represented hundreds of both indigent and needy clients in hearings/trials and plea deals.

Most recently in 2017, Stacey enjoyed a tenure as a Court Attorney for a Judge in Kings County Supreme Civil term where she conducted settlement conferences with litigants to narrow legal issues. Additionally as a Court Attorney, she conducted evidentiary hearings on tort matters, reviewed motions and drafted opinions, decisions, orders, and conferred with and advised the judge on legal issues.

Throughout her legal career, Stacey has been an active leader in civic organizations such as the New York City Bar Association's Special Committee to Encourage Judicial Service, Bronx Bar Association and the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., Iota Epsilon Omega chapter member.
