



Faraz Khan is the Legislative Director of the International Federation of Professional and Technical Engineers (IFPTE), an AFL-CIO-affiliated labor union representing 90,000 professional employees working across a diverse set of industries and in government in the U.S. and Canada. IFPTE's affiliated unions include the National Association of Immigration Judges (NAIJ), the Association of Administrative Law Judges (AALJ), as well as legal professionals working in nonprofit and advocacy organizations.

With over 20 years of experience in the labor movement, Khan's career has focused on legislative advocacy and public policy, as well as strategic research in support of union organizing. Working alongside IFPTE's local union leaders and members, Khan has helped advance IFPTE members' interests in Congress and in the Executive Branch on a variety of issues including protecting the federal civil service, immigration policy, trade and economic policy, as well as policies and legislation specific to the aerospace industry, the energy sector, and federal employees' concerns. He is a co-chair of the legislative committee of the Federal Workers Alliance, a coalition of labor organizations that collectively represents 550,000 federal and postal employees. He works directly with AFL-CIO staff and advises the labor federation about policy positions and legislative priorities on immigration, STEM workforce issues, and federal investments in research and development.
