Originally from Western Nebraska, Astrid earned her bachelor's of journalism from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and her law degree from Washington University in St. Louis. She is licensed to practice law in Maryland and Nebraska and is fluent in Spanish.

In addition to her legal practice, Astrid is an adjunct at the Nebraska College of Law, where she has taught pretrial litigation since 2021. She regularly engages in local level civics. Her accomplishments include reviving an annual neighborhood cleanup, starting a community garden, advocating for the funding of a diversity club at her former high school, increasing voter turnout among Latinos and American Indians, and advising her hometown on the redevelopment of a historically Latino/American Indian neighborhood. More recently, Astrid has turned to the writing of short fiction stories to address DEI issues, a number of which have been published by Civic Nebraska, a nonpartisan nonprofit dedicated to enhancing democracy across the state.
