



Dr. Kathleen Darcy is an assistant professor in Criminology, Law, and Criminal Justice at University of Michigan-Dearborn. She holds a PhD from Michigan State University in Criminal Justice, a Master's degree from University of Chicago with an focus on law, criminal justice, history, and human rights, and a BA in English from University of Michigan Ann Arbor. Dr. Darcy also holds a law degree from Michigan State University College of Law and is licensed to practice law in Michigan. Her research is interdisciplinary and primarily focuses on examining gender inequity, especially how the law impacts those affected by gender-based violence. She is particularly concerned with understanding system dynamics that exacerbate and contribute to harm when abuse occurs in institutional settings (e.g., prison, higher education, the military). Her work has been published in *The Georgetown Journal of Gender and the Law*, *Pepperdine Law Review*, *Feminist Criminology*, *Criminal Justice Policy Review*, and *Law and Human Behavior*, among others.
